HOT SUN AT THE MAY WORKING PARTY

This photograph demonstrates the method of working that has now been agreed as a standard for re-lining work. To start with the lining has been laid 25 metres ahead of the completed work. As can be seen in the photo, the spoil on the top of the bank is being placed and this continues until all 25 metres of both banks is completed.

Next a 20 metres roll of Bentomat is laid on the bed with an overlap over the previous roll and the joint is covered with a concrete 'sleeping policeman' as protection against damage from future dredging and also acts as a strut between the concrete block lining on the banks. You can see the mixer in position ready for action. The Bentomat is then covered with 300mm of spoil as it is unrolled.

There is now 5 metres left for storing the mixer and materials ready for the next repeat operation that will be extending the bank lining by 20 metres and laying another 20 metres of bed lining, still leaving a 5 metre storage area.

You will also see that the use of mechanical plant is being kept to a minimum as the excavator in the background is profiling the next 20 metres of banks while only one dumper is required to move the spoil along to the excavator covering the lining with spoil. Unfortunately disaster struck us at the May working party when KESCRG came to continue their good work at Whitehouses. In recent weeks we had noticed the weak state of the lime mortar and thought it was due to frost damage similar to that found on Little Tring Bridge but less than 24 hours before the working party started we received a report from CRT's contractors for the CRT work at Whitehouses that the mortar had failed. This baffled us until Saturday morning when Roy Sutton, a former honorary consulting civil engineer to the IWA who was working with KESCRG, identified the problem. The wrong type of lime had been used and any new brickwork repairs will have to be rebuilt. Some of us are now a lot wiser on the use of lime mortar! Very disappointing but KESCRG have made a good start with the footpath/nature trail from Bridge 4 to Whitehouses that winds through the wooded area alongside the canal.

The WRG Forestry Team was also in attendance on the Saturday and felled the three trees at the bottom of the old council tip adjacent to the canal near Bridge 4A. This will give us extra tipping space as well as stabilising the base of the very high tip face. Many thanks to Herts County Council and their tenant farmer, Keith Slade, on whose land we are carrying out these works.

June Working Party

With good weather, apart from some heavy rain on the Friday night, work progressed for another 20 metres so this year we have now completed 80 metres since relining started up again in March.

Sunday saw the first of the open days when visitors were welcomed at St Mary's Church Drayton Beauchamp where teas, cakes etc. were sold and entertainment provided by the Barber's Shop choir. Most importantly the visitors could join visits to site at regular intervals where they were given details of the restoration and see the work in progress on the relining.

July/August Working Parties

July promises to be a busy week as KESCRG will be with us all week working again on Whitehouses and hopefully the WAT team will make further good progress on relining.

In August we have our annual nine day working party and it would be a great step forward if we could complete relining Stage 2 by then leaving us 100 metres of Stage 3 to reach Bridge 4A and the end of the next re-watering. KESCRG will also be with us for the first two days continuing their good work at Whitehouses.

IWA Chiltern Branch weekend away

Every year the Chiltern Branch arranges a weekend visiting an area of the country with waterway interests and sometimes include a restored railway trip.

This year the area is East Anglia where we will visit navigable rivers including river trips, one on a Thames sailing barge. I have already emailed details to restoration team members who are on the internet but, for the benefit of those who have not already received details, I attach them with a booking form. About half of our volunteers are Chiltern Branch members, most of who go on these weekends away with their wives as well as quite a few who are not IWA members as these visits are open to anyone with waterway interests. If you come on the weekend you will find yourself among friends and it is very much a social occasion enjoyed by all and somewhat more relaxing than relining our canal or helping at an event. Tree planting

Phill Cardy recently brought us five small trees for planting, three oaks, a whitethorn and a plum. They are presently under the tender care of our resident horticulturist, Margaret Leishman, but the intention is to place them alongside the hedge that Ken Graves planted across the tip site at the winding hole.

As you can see they are all flourishing but need to be larger to survive at the winding hole.

There is disappointment in that Margaret's attempts to take hardwood cuttings from the prunus tree at Whitehouses do not seem to be successful despite two separate attempts over two years and expert advice from the RHS of which Margaret is a member.

General Notes

We operate as a self-supervising group under CRT and all volunteers receive and sign for the Trust's Restoration Handbook that includes full Health and Safety requirements for the restoration works.

The handbook is the property of the Trust; if you leave the working parties for any reason, please return your Handbook to either Ray Orth or myself.

Hard hats for use at all times and high visibility jackets to be worn on sites with mobile plant in use are kept in the store at Tringford and must be drawn/returned there. One first aid kit is kept in the store and one in the Nissan Cabstar and each qualified first-aider will have their own kit with him/her when on site.

Also available in the store at Tringford are ear defenders and goggles that must be worn when using strimmers, angle grinders, concrete breakers and the like. CRT will supply hard hats, gloves and footwear with reinforced toecaps on request. We normally work from 9am to 5pm (or dark if earlier!).

There are breaks for morning tea/coffee, packed lunch and afternoon tea/coffee. We take our own food and drink.

- 09:15 Depart High Wycombe
- 09:35 Depart Amersham
- 09:50 Depart Chesham
- 10:15 Depart Watford
- 12:00 Arrive at the Hythe Quay, Maldon to board the traditional Thames sailing barge 'Kitty'.
- 12:30 We begin a two hour 'Two Islands' sail which will take in Brithnorth, Northey Island, Millbeach and Osea Island.
- 14:30 On our return to Hythe Quay, a buffet lunch will be served on board. Participants will then be able to relax on board or stroll the local area until 17:00
- 17:00 Rejoin our coach for the drive to Chelmsford
- 18:00 Arrive at the Miami Hotel, Chelmsford for overnight accommodation and dinner.
