A remarkable milestone

Since my last 6-monthly progress report the Trust has reached a significant milestone. The total cost of restoration works since Phase I commenced in 1997 has passed the £1 million mark at £1,013,999! See my report on page 3.

This means that the Trust has raised over £1 million pounds from fund raising events, mainly the Annual Festivals at Little Tring, and donations. The Trust also received £200.000 from the then BW in lieu of replacing the 18" pipeline under the bed of the canal and the Tim Wilkinson beguest of £100,000 that is represented by the £300,000 currently in the bank ring-fenced against matched funding for the Heritage Lottery Fund bid.

During these working parties work will concentrate on profiling, laying the Bentomite lining and hollow concrete blocks on both banks in readiness for the visit by BITM in June ready for them to lay the high density concrete blocks. Hopefully this will help to significantly advance bank lining over the summer.

These pictures show how much more useful the Morooka dumper (top) supplied by Morgans was for work such as transporting concrete blocks. It has a rectangular body with a flat deck whereas the more expensive dumper (below) we now have to hire has a hopper shaped body. This makes it more difficult to unload ready-mix concrete with an excavator when concrete cannot be directly discharged to where it is wanted.

Whitehouses

We await details from CRT for their proposal for a pseudo weir and wing walls to the wharf wall at Whitehouses. Once this is to hand it is hoped that the Trust will be able to complete the higher level pipe capping in front of the wharf wall.

You can see from the picture below how the brick base to the wharf wall and settling tank projects into the canal and requires special attention because of the shallow depth – well above normal bed level.

This because newly planted trees have to be kept watered and no more will be planted until November this year.

General Notes

We operate as a self-supervising group under CRT and all volunteers receive and sign for the Trust's Restoration Handbook that includes full Health and Safety requirements for the restoration works.

The handbook is the property of the Trust; if you leave the working parties for any reason, please return your Handbook to either Ray Orth or myself.

Hard hats for use at all times and high visibility jackets to be worn on sites with mobile plant in use are kept in the store at Tringford and must be drawn/returned there.

One first aid kit is kept in the store and one in the Nissan Cabstar and each qualified first-aider will have their own kit with him/her when on site.

Also available in the store at Tringford are ear defenders and goggles that must be worn when using strimmers, angle grinders, concrete breakers and the like. CRT will supply hard hats, gloves and footwear with reinforced toecaps on request.

We normally work from 9am to 5pm (or dark if earlier!). There are breaks for morning tea/coffee, packed lunch and afternoon tea/coffee. We take our own food and drink.


