Chairman's Column

What a change since my piece in our Spring newsletter written back in the dark days of February with only a glimmer of light on the horizon. At that time we were unable to do anything at all on the work site due to the latest covid lockdown.

As previously, we used the enforced down time to plan ahead and were duly able to get back on site in April with a renewed sense of purpose, vigour and optimism.

I would first ask you to join me in welcoming three new members on to Council.

Clive Wilson, our current treasurer and archivist, is stepping down from the treasurer role to take up a finance role with Chilterns IWA – please join me in thanking him and wishing him well in the future. I am pleased to say he will be continuing as our archivist.

Paul Armstrong joins us as treasurer and Steve Chapman and Will Matthew join from the restoration team. Both are already making a great contribution to our restoration project and are very proactive in helping develop our forward strategies.



The safety and well being of our volunteers is always our priority and for the restart we improved our provision of sanitation & welfare facilities and planned work so that people were in small groups in different locations enabling social distancing. Tasks included putting finishing touches to the Whitehouses site which had almost been



completed at the end of 2020 and completing wing walls to fend off future passing boats.



Much of this involved heritage brickwork and lime mortar. Our on line appeal for bricklayers familiar with this work was rewarded with several new volunteers turning up virtually the next day for which we were hugely grateful.

These skills were also required for renovation of the old swing bridge walls by bridge 4 which is ongoing. Stop planks are now installed by bridge 4 ready for re-watering which we hope to do this later summer once final approvals from CRT are to hand. Following long deliberations and the burning of much midnight oil our tip investigation team led a trial excavation earlier in the period and this proved that their method worked successfully. Focus is now on finding the most cost effective way of translating this success in to the full



scale removal that we need to do.

Protection of the old under bed pipe to prevent damage to the canal liner if it collapsed is still essential but Tony and colleagues have devised a new and more efficient way of doing this, being up to four times quicker compared to previously. Being wider than before it also provides a temporary roadway to the work site which will be a massive benefit in the wet and muddy conditions of winter.

All this activity on site has attracted a great deal of positive comment from members of the public on the towpath and led to even more skilled volunteers joining our ranks.

Our rapid progress with excavation & pipe capping has now created a major short term problem with temporary storage of spoil, much of which will be reused as lining proceeds.

Unfortunately much of it is contaminated with the remains of the original lining material, coal tar, which was used in Victorian times to try and stop it leaking. Many investigations have been done and a small task force is now urgently looking to find the best solution out of all the options open to us and permitted within current legislation.

Any solution is going to necessitate taking considerable quantities of spoil off site with associated costs.

Alongside all of the works mentioned above which are concentrated near Lt Tring, our colleague, Peter Elwin has been working with the Chiltern AONB Review Group, Wendover Parish Council and Wendover & Villages Community Board to try and secure funding to upgrade the heavily used and badly eroded towpath starting at Wharf Road, Wendover. Detailed plans and costing have been produced by CRT/Kier.

At the time of writing we are very optimistic of success and hope to be able to make an announcement soon regarding the first two of these groups.

Peter is also making excellent progress in developing contacts with Tring/ Dacorum/Herts Councils to support works at the Lt Tring area.

Along with our accelerated progress we are now launching our new working name, "Wendover Canal Trust" and corporate image – huge thanks to Bob Wheal and the Marketing team for getting us to this point.

This summer newsletter is the first "outing" for our revised look - more details from Bob elsewhere in this issue.

As I mentioned last time all the progress we are making and the challenges ahead are going to be costly.

Our Finance colleague Doug Pell is pursuing several major funding applications but if <u>you</u> can help by way of a donation or would like to set up a legacy please do get in touch – my email and the trust phone number are at the foot of this piece.



Thank you all, Council colleagues, volunteers and members, for your support – let's all look forward to another year of achievement and hope we can finally put lockdowns behind us!

Finance Review

Results for this year reflect an acceleration in the costs of restoration work, while on the other hand income is lower due to lower receipts from donations and legacies. As a result, available cash at bank and from investments has fallen from $\pounds 636,870$ to $\pounds 506,495$.

This is however sufficient to enable the Trust to continue its work and fulfil its charitable purpose in restoring the canal for the benefit of the public.

During the year the Trust has installed a new membership system and a new accounting system, which will enable better tracking of member contributions, costs and budgets.

Operations Report

This is a summary of Tony Bardwell's Operation Reports from April to July, edited by Clive Johnson. The full reports can be read on our website.

Our volunteers have made considerable progress by working for 2 weeks in each of these 4 months. The most visible achievement is that Pipe Capping has been completed for three-quarters of the way from Bridge 4 to the Little Tring cart track entrance! Also our bricklayers continue to improve the remains of the old Bridge 4. Unfortunately little further progress has been made on the Tip – we are still investigating the most cost-effective quotes. More details below.

Pipe Capping

The section of canal being restored has an 18" glazed clay pipe installed underneath to allow water from Wendover to reach the pumping station when the canal was "dried" many years ago. Due to the age of the pipe (which is now abandoned and blocked) protective measures must be taken to avoid damage to the new lining system if the pipe ever collapses. A concrete "raft" or capping is being installed to do that. The capping is now being made wider, to make it easier to lay by pouring direct from dumpers, and to allow it to be used as an access road. This costs more in ready-mix now, but will save on Plant Hire by finishing the job quicker. Spectacular progress has been made, come and see it if you can!



Bridge 4 Brickwork

Our volunteer expert bricklayers have continued with repairs and rebuilding the remains of the old Bridge 4.





This is being done with great care and the right materials, and so is taking a long time.

Tip Clearance and other Spoil

In April we completely cleared everything which has accumulated over the years on top of the Tip. At the time we hoped that this was ready for it all to be excavated, but discussions continue on the best quote for the work, and also funding for this work. The latest sticking point is determining what type of Zinc is in the Tip.

We have now temporarily used the Tip to store excavated clay spoil, to clear the way for the Pipe Capping we have done. We have realised that we have a surplus of this clay spoil. Unfortunately the clay spoil is contaminated with Coal Tar from the Victorian lining, and we have set up a sub-group to investigate and advise us on disposal options.

Bridge 4a to 4 Re-watering

This length of canal is ready for re-watering as soon as CRT give permission. Stop planks have been installed next to Bridge 4 ready for this.

New name, new logo, new beginning

You will have noticed that this is now called Wendover Canal News and comes from the Wendover Canal Trust, with a different logo and different email contact

addresses to the ones you are used to.

What's going on?

There's not much in our name to tell anyone from outside the canal "bubble" that we are even associated with Canals. Instead, we find we have to constantly explain what an 'Arm' is and then go on to talk about our restoration work. There is also an unrelated hotel in High Wycombe called the Wendover Arms.

Our logo is no help at all. It may be familiar (even attractive) to those of us who are members and supporters and know the Trust. But to someone who only has a vague idea of what a canal is, the logo is of no help, and is a colour which we no longer use.

In the coming years as the Trust's finances have to support ever more expensive and ambitious tasks, it becomes more important than ever that our name is visible and accepted by potential supporters and donation/grant giving bodies. Internet searches for 'Canal Trust', for example, must give a result with our name prominently shown. We can only expect to attract new members and grants if our purpose is clear.

Having a logo with a clear reference to a canal will also help to cement our identity. Having a new logo brings a long overdue opportunity to update it to something more relevant.

To have the best chance of reaching future members, supporters, and potential donors we are better with a name which more closely identifies us with who we are.

Hence the name Wendover Canal Trust.

There are secondary benefits, too.

- The Arm has long been called the Wendover Canal by local residents and visitors. Calling ourselves Wendover Canal Trust gives us added legitimacy, and gives the canal and ourselves increased recognition.
 - Our new internet domain wendovercanal.org.uk, (which is part of our email and website addresses) should mean that internet searches will be more likely to find us. The old website and email addresses will continue to work but won't be publicised.

The new domain name uses the org.uk identifier, commonly used by charities. This means we can avoid using the *co.uk* style, which is intended to be used by a profit-driven commercial company.

What is actually changing?

- The Wendover Arm Trust has registered Wendover Canal Trust as a working name, which will be used in all general day to day activities.
- The name Wendover Arm Trust has not been deleted: It remains in use for financial and commercial transactions.
- The registered address of the Trust continues as before to be: Wendover Canal Trust, Island House, Moor Road, Chesham Bucks, HP5 1WA.
- The governance and management for Wendover Canal Trust remain unchanged. It is only the name which is being updated.
- Our website, media pages, newsletter, correspondence, publications, and general communications will all use the name Wendover Canal Trust.
- In the same way that WAT refers colloquially to Wendover Arm Trust, feel free to use the term WCT to refer to Wendover Canal Trust

What else will change?

We updated our logo. The new logo design references one of the greatest Trust achievements to date – the rebuilding of Little Tring Bridge, as well as reminding ourselves that more bridge rebuilds will be required! In fact, we do not have a shortage of projects needing capital funding.

Clearance of the Historic Domestic Tip at Tring, rebuilding the old main road bridge at Buckland, Rebuilding Halton Road bridge, as well as completing the relining at Little Tring will all need significant funding. All the more important then, that we maximise our chances of being recognised and identified by funders.

With a new logo, it would be logical to expect a new clothing and branded goods range to be available. Whilst that is a likely eventual outcome, there are no immediate plans to introduce a complete range immediately. Instead, for the time being replacement stock will follow demand.

To avoid unnecessary printing and

design costs, leaflets and booklets will be revised over time. when reprints would in any case be required.

What about the many signs and displays which need updating?

Yes, there are many plaques, signs and display boards which need to be updated. Many (most?) signs and boards are showing their age, or simply display out of date information and are overdue to be renewed or replaced.

The cost of replacement and renewal is part of our normal publicity budgeting. That's not to say that a sponsorship offer would be unwelcome ...

What happens to my membership? Who do I pay?

Nothing happens to your membership, except that you will see increasing reference to **Wendover Canal Trust** in letters and notices. Your payment details can remain the same (unless you want to switch from a standing order or regular cheque payment to a direct debit arrangement – that will save us money and give our membership secretary fewer issues to deal with).

Your payments should continue to be made to Wendover Arm Trust, as before. Gift Aid arrangements also remain the same.



When is all this happening?

Well, as you can see, the newsletter has already been updated. Our website has been referring to the Wendover Canal for some time now (did you notice?). Our leaflets will be updated (for content as well as appearance) as the stock is used up, and you should see our new name and logo in emails and general correspondence as it appears.

With a new name, a new logo, and a new appearance, our challenge now is to publicise Wendover Canal Trust as widely as possible.

The formal adoption date for our working name will be in October.
