

Chairman's Column—Summer 2024

On June 28th, our Patron Robbie Cumming cut the tape to formally open our towpath improvement between Wendover and Halton. The day went very well, thanks largely to the hard work of Peter Elwin assisted by Mikk Bradley, and you can read the report of Richard Peel (our PR advisor for the event) elsewhere. Our work party had also just completed the

work party had also just completed the building of a new wall, railings and signage at the beginning of the canal at Wharf Road, Wendover – a

much-admired improvement over the previous fencing and shrubbery, as you can see from the before and after photos. Passers-by can now see that there is a canal there!

Our volunteers have also recently upgraded the final 260m of towpath to Bridge 4, building on their previous work starting at the entrance from Little Tring Road. We were very grateful to receive a Defra grant from

Chilterns National Landscapes, a generous anonymous gift and a donation of 20 tonnes of Type 1 from Dacorum Borough Council.

I hope you all enjoyed the new series of Robbie's Canal Boat Diaries as much as I did. It was shown in the first fortnight of June on weekday evenings, but will no doubt be repeated as well as being available on catch

-up.

However I'm afraid our canal re-lining still remains suspended, which is frustrating for us all. Ros Daniels, CRT's Director of London & SE, formally wrote to us on 2nd

August, highlighting a number of specific actions taken by our volunteers before and since these problems began. I am very sorry to tell you that as a result, our Site Manager Mikk Bradley has resigned from this position, though we very much hope that he will continue to help us in a more advisory capacity. His predecessor Tony Bardwell has also been helping us in this way.

So we met Ros and her Head of Operations Charlotte Wood, in Leighton Buzzard on 13th August. This was to discuss the wider relationship between our organisations, and was our first face to face discussion since our recent problems began in May 2023. Historically there has never been any



formal contract between us, which we both want to correct, so that our respective responsibilities can be clearly laid out. CRT will be drafting "Heads of Terms" for a suitable agreement. We regard this as a very positive development, as we do Ros's strong support at this meeting for our restoration work in general. We can move towards a re-start of work when the Heads of Terms have been signed off with CRT and any accompanying changes are in place.

In the last newsletter I said that the water level in our restored section had reached its highest ever level. How quickly things can change! By late July, the Wendover Canal between Wendover and Tring is once more choked with reeds. Mikk Bradlev has found that the water level at Wharf Road, Wendover is slightly above Tring summit level, and water is once more having to be released away from the canal system past Weston Turville reservoir. Yet at Whitehouses the level is 1.1 metres below Tring summit level, a fall of 1.2 metres (four feet) in only about four miles. CRT's Contract Manager Roger Maidment plans to employ The Rothen Group to use a long reach digger and Truxor boat to clear the reeds in the autumn, which will improve the situation significantly. The need continues however for a sustainable solution to this annual reed growth.

Finance Review

For all the known reasons, the level of activity for the year to 31st March 2024 as recorded by the financial accounts was at a very low level. The Trust income for the year was just £36k, and of that £11k was income from investments, which increased as a result of higher interest rates. Subscriptions were down by 20% and donations by 35% compared with the previous year this is an area which requires attention in the current year. Expenditure on raising funds decreased to £14k, as the previous year included exceptional costs related to the formation of Wendover Canal Restoration Ltd (WCRL). Expenditure on restoration was less than £5k. however this does not include expenditure via WCRL, of which more later. As a result the accounts show a surplus of income over expenditure of £17k, and, funds available increased from £422k to nearly £440k.

As noted these figures exclude activity via WCRL, which is now accounted for separately as requested by the accountants. WCRL had income for the year of £28k, mainly from grants from EKFB for signage and Chiltern Conservation Board for towpath work, while restoration costs were incurred of £34k, leaving a small loss of £6k. These costs included £13k for the Southern Testing report that was commissioned at the request of CRT. Net VAT recovered using WCRL amounted to £7.5k. Note that Debtors of £75k in WCT mainly consists of an intercompany loan to WCRL of \pm 71k, which is partly offset by cash held in WCRL of \pm 29k and retained earnings of \pm 25k.

Total funds available to WCT at the end of the year, including cash at bank and investments, stand at £422k. On the face of it therefore WCT appears to be in a strong financial position, and indeed it will have sufficient funds for the current financial year (which will also probably have a relatively low spend) and going forward at least until 31st March 2026. But the total cost of canal restoration over the next three vears will be in the region of £800k. and the project therefore cannot be completed without seeking further funds, e.g. from the National Lottery Heritage Fund.

TV Personality Robbie Cumming formally opens towpath

A host of walkers, cyclists, canoeists and schoolchildren joined in the celebration at the official opening of the Wendover to Halton towpath upgrade, with Robbie Cumming, TV presenter and our patron, cutting the ribbon.

The event on Friday 28th June, held at Walnut Tree Meadow, Wendover, attracted large crowds, with 220 pupils from John Colet School walking in groups down the towpath to



Halton. While they were walking more than 30 primary schoolchildren from Wendover Church of England Junior School took part in a nature trail.

The Cracklewick Morris dancers put on two performances and there was a call to attention fanfare sounded by Kathy Gifford. She also played a fanfare after Robbie Cumming, presenter of TV's 'Canal Boat Diaries' cut the ribbon to formally open the towpath.

Pupils from Wendover Church of England Junior School enjoyed a Teddy Bear's picnic - thanks to EKFB. The company also produced a nature trail worksheet and gave out 'passports' for children to complete on the day, reflecting their experiences.

There were talks on geology and the environment by experts from EKFB for pupils from John Colet School who were also given a quiz by their geography teacher.

In his speech Clive Johnson, Chairman of the WCT thanked Robbie and Dr Elaine King from Chilterns National Landscape, whose organisation played a major role in securing funding.



He also thanked Ros Daniels of the Canal & River Trust, Councillor Steve Broadbent of Buckinghamshire Council and Peter Elwin, WCT Partnerships Director, who led the funding and the organisation of the event. "Funded by five organisations, the towpath upgrading took six months to complete, cost £750.000 and runs for 1.7

miles" said Clive. "It is part of both the Wendover Canal Trust's and Canal &

River Trust's wider ambition to see the entire seven-mile Wendover to Grand Union canal towpath upgraded.". The work carried out by Rothen Group and Kier plc has hugely improved the former muddy towpath. For the first time we have made it accessible to the entire community all year round."
